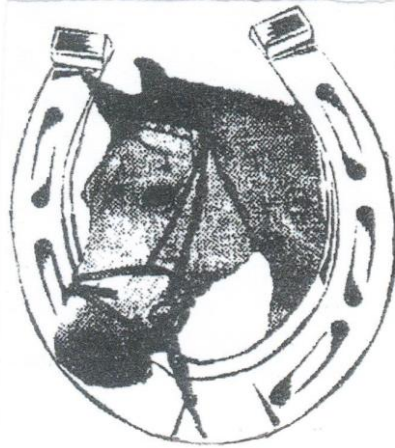

### **Membership for 2010**

Age to be taken as at 1<sup>st</sup> January in the current year

### **Club Show Entry Fees**

1 Class	£ 4.00
4 Classes	£15.00

If 4 classes are entered there will be no refund on the 4<sup>th</sup> class.

Additional classes i.e. Chase –me-Charlie, Higher & Higher, minimus show jumping entry will be £1.50 per class, pay on entry.

**First Aid please add £1.50 per competitor**

## **SHOWING RING 1 START 9.30 A.M.**

1. Tack and Turnout – Competitors will be marked only on the turnout of themselves and their mount. There will be no ridden show.
2. Style & Appearance – Lead rein/10 yrs & under (snaffle bridles only)
3. Style & Appearance – not exc. 14.2hh
4. Style & Appearance- exc. 14.2hh
5. Ridden Cob Type – May be hogged and trimmed or shown in natural state  
May not enter Ridden Mountain & Moorland Classes
6. Ridden Coloured – any height

## **SHOWING RING 2 START 11.30 A.M.**

7. Ridden Hunter Type – May not enter Riding Horse
8. Riding Horse – May not enter Hunter Type.
9. Ex Racers/ Thoroughbreds/Part Bred
10. Ridden Veteran (Horse/pony 15yrs & over) – any height- (Proof of age may be required)
11. Mountain & Moorland- Lead rein/10 years & under (may not enter class 12)
12. Ridden Mountain & Moorland – any height (may not enter class 11)

**Each person may enter each class only once**

## **MOST APPEALING PONY START 11.15 A.M.**

13. Most Appealing Pony – 10 years and under
14. Most Appealing Horse/Pony – 11years and over to include adults

Ponies/Horses can be shown in-hand or ridden, on or off the lead rein.

## **RIDEABILITY START 10.00 A.M. – 1 P.M.**

**(Competitors may enter at any time during this period)**

Competitors will be asked to ride the Horse/Pony incorporating disciplines that will be at the judges discretion.

15. Rideability – 10 years and under
16. Rideability – 11 – 13 years
17. Rideability – 14 -16 years
18. Rideability – 17 years and over.

## **WORKING HUNTER START 10.30 A.M.**

Working Hunter classes will consist of 2 phases – jumping and showing. The jumping course will consist of at least 5 fences, all of a hunting type, built from rustic material and as substantial as possible.

Penalties are as follows

1 <sup>st</sup> Refusal	15 penalties
2 <sup>nd</sup> Refusal	20 penalties
3 <sup>rd</sup> Refusal	Elimination
Each knockdown	10 penalties
Fall of horse/rider	Elimination

A complete turnaround or resistance is judged as a refusal.

No schooling whips. No combination of horse and rider may enter more than one class. A person may enter each class only once.

19. Working Hunter – Lead rein. Jumps up to 1'6''
20. Working Hunter – 10 years & under. Jumps up to 2'0''
21. Beginner s Working Hunter – any height. Jumps up to 2'3''  
(May not enter show jumping classes any higher than novice or any other working hunter class)
22. Working Hunter – Mountain & Moorland. Jumps up to 2'3''
23. Novice Working Hunter – exc. 14hh. Jumps up to 2'6''
24. Open Working Hunter – any height. Jumps up to 3'.0''

## **DRESSAGE START 11.00 A.M.**

If a rider is entered in the Beginners class they may NOT enter any other Dressage class on any horse/rider combination.

25. Beginners Dressage (Adult & Junior)
26. Preliminary Dressage (Junior)
27. Preliminary Dressage (Adult)
28. Novice Dressage (Adult & Junior)
29. Elementary Dressage (Adult & Junior)

## **SHOW JUMPING CLASSES**

**BEGINNERS** – A combination may only enter this class if they have not won or been runner up in a previous season.

**NOVICE** – Combination of horse/pony and rider not to have been placed 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> in any previous season (in any class other than beginners)

Show jumping combinations can only enter 2 show jumping classes (not inc. Pairs) i.e. Beginners/Novice, Novice/Intermediate, Intermediate/Open. Higher classes can however be entered non-competitively.

### **SCORING**

1 <sup>st</sup> & 2 <sup>nd</sup> refusal	4 faults each	3 <sup>rd</sup> refusal	Elimination
Each knockdown	4 faults	Fall of horse/rider	Elimination

A complete turnaround is judged as a refusal. Resistance is judged as a refusal and where resistance is for more than 1 minute the competitor will be eliminated.

Competitors who start before the starting bell/whistle has been sounded will be eliminated. Course error will also result in elimination.

### **MINIMUS RING START 12.45 P.M**

Class 30. Lead rein

31. 10 years & under

Lead reiners may enter 10 years and under non comp. and 10 years & under may enter Beginners non comp.

32. Pairs jumping

After jumping, the 1<sup>st</sup> rider must hand the whip to the 2<sup>nd</sup> rider to complete the changeover. (10 second penalty for a knockdown)

**A horse/pony may only enter this class twice**

**Minimus will be open throughout the day as announced**

### **SHOW JUMPING – MAIN RING START 11.30 A.M.**

33. Beginners – not exc. 14.2hh
34. Beginners – exc. 14.2hh
35. Novice – not exc. 14.2hh
36. Novice – exc. 14.2hh
37. Intermediate – not exc. 14.2hh
38. Intermediate – exc. 14.2hh
39. Open – all heights

## **HANDY PONY START 11.30 A.M. UNTIL 3.30 P.M**

40. Handy pony – lead rein 5 years & under
41. Handy pony – lead rein 6 – 8 years
42. Handy pony – 10 years and under
43. Handy pony – 11 – 14 years
44. Handy pony – 15 years and over

No combination of horse & rider may enter more than one class. No whips or spurs allowed in this ring.

## **GAMES START AT APPROX. 2.00 P.M.**

45. Games –lead rein 5 years and under
46. Games – lead rein 6 – 8 years
47. Games – 10 years and under
48. Games – 11 – 14 years
49. Games – 15 years and over

## **GAMES SECTION – RULES**

1. Each pony may be ridden only once in each age group.
2. Each rider may enter no more than one pony in each game.
3. Any combinations of horse & rider, which have qualified to do so, may ride in a final ride off.
4. Ponies in lead rein games must not exceed 12.2hh.
5. The leader in lead rein games must be 14 years or over.
6. No spurs or whips will be allowed in the games.
7. Walk or trot only in 5 years and under.
8. All general rules will apply.
9. The wearing of body protectors is recommended.

## **IN-HAND START 1.00 P.M.**

50. Young Handler – Leader 10 years and under

(Competitors may be accompanied by an adult)

51. Young Handler – Leader aged 11 to 16 years

Please note classes 50 & 51 may be amalgamated if insufficient entries

52. Open Pony/Open Horse –any Age, Colour, Breeding

53. Mountain & Moorland - Please note class 53 may be split in to small & large breeds if sufficient entries

54. Coloured/Appaloosa/Spotted – Any Age, Height, Breeding

55. Hunter Type – Any Age/Height

56. Veteran – Horses/Ponies 15years & over – Proof of age may be required

57. Ex Racers /Thoroughbred/Part Bred

Handlers must be of smart appearance at all times in the ring. (See general rules)

### **Times may be subject to change**

If you are unsure of which class to enter please ask for advice in the cabin.

## **POINTS COMPETITION SECTION**

1. All competitive club classes & all gymkhana games points shall count towards the members points competition.
2. Points shall be awarded as follows:

1 <sup>st</sup> place	6 points	4 <sup>th</sup> place	3 points
2 <sup>nd</sup> place	5 points	5 <sup>th</sup> place	2 points
3 <sup>rd</sup> place	4 points	6 <sup>th</sup> place	1 point
3. The member gaining the most points throughout the year in a particular group and discipline shall be deemed the overall winner for that group and discipline.
4. No points shall accrue until after membership fees for the current year have been paid.
5. Points are awarded for combinations of horse/pony and rider/handler. A rider/handler may not aggregate points with more than one animal.
6. A combination of horse/pony & rider/handler must enter a class at least 3 times to qualify for an end of season trophy.

# RULES SECTION

## GENERAL

1. If you have a complaint please lodge your grievance with any committee member at the show. Any type of abuse toward a judge or other club official will not be tolerated and result in the person being asked to leave the ground and their membership being revoked
2. Except when competing in the ring or working in the designated practice area animals must proceed at a walk.
3. Competitors may exercise their horse/pony in the area provided. They must not exercise in the car park or horsebox area or in the spectator areas.
4. Correct riding attire must be worn at all times while mounted on the show ground, particularly hard hats and riding boots.
5. No animal under 4 years old shall be allowed in any ridden class.
6. Stallions are welcome but must be bitted from yearling onwards.
7. Lead rein classes – Children to be aged 8 years and under. Ponies not exc. 12.2hh.
8. The leader in all lead rein classes inc. Most Appealing must be over 14 years.
9. Lead rein competitors may not compete in any other class off lead rein. Any competitor coming off lead rein during the season must declare their intent as only one set of points will be counted towards the end of season trophies.
10. Lead rein ponies must be in a snaffle bridle with the lead rein attached to the noseband.
11. No junior competitor may wear spurs at any time on the show ground.
12. All dogs must be kept on a lead whilst on the show ground. Owners of dogs who foul on the field must clear it up take it with them.
13. Where the height of a horse/pony is in dispute a height certificate may be requested or the animal measured.
14. Except where those rules are inconsistent with the rules made by the SDSC, the rules of the B.H.S. and B.S.J.A. shall apply.
15. We strongly advise the wearing of body protectors.
16. A full set of rules is available for inspection in the cabin.
17. If insufficient entries, classes may be amalgamated.
18. Excessive use of the whip or ill treatment will not be tolerated.
19. Anyone parking a vehicle inappropriately will be asked to move.
20. Any perpetual trophies presented annually must be returned no later than the last club show
21. The AGM will be held during February.
